Dear Friends,

The month you've been waiting for is here: pursuing the fruit of patience. It was described by John Chrysostom as 'the queen of virtues, the foundation of right action, peace in war, calm in tempest, security in plots.' Fairly all-embracing! Patience or 'long-suffering' is seen as being a quality which lies at the very heart of God (e.g. 2 Peter 3:9). Patience is reproduced in our lives by the Spirit of God but our attitude should be far from passive. We are called to actively pursue it. Paul calls us to put it on as if a garment (Col 3:12) and to 'walk in it' by putting it into practice (Eph 4:2).



Patience embraces endurance and courage. It is especially applied in the context of forbearing with one another, choosing to overlook offences in a way which leads to a culture of forgiveness and grace in our lives. Patience is associated with waiting expectantly, especially for God to act. It produces a harvest of joy and peace in our lives.

At this precise moment we are in a hospital waiting room attempting to exercise patience! As with any of the fruit, patience will grow most when your circumstances present you with the option to choose an equal and opposite response. The apostle Paul connects patience with keeping going in times of affliction and suffering. If we really want to excel in the fruit of patience then perhaps we should expect tribulation!

This month FoNEWS looks a little different. We have included Fountain Network News which gives feedback and information on some of the members of the Network. There are some very exciting things going on around the region and this is just a snapshot from our viewpoint. We hope you are encouraged as you read the stories of people who see themselves connected to this place. HANDY HELP for ex-Service personnel and their families

The Royal British Legion operates *Poppy Calls* which provides a free dedicated handy-person service to those who are unable to carry out small repairs and minor alterations to their homes.



The service is FREE to those who satisfy the eligibility criteria of The Royal British Legion. You are eligible if you have served in the Forces for at least seven days or are the dependent of someone who has served; this includes widows, widowers, cohabiting partners or civil partners of ex-Service people.

Handy person tasks include:

- changing light bulbs and tap washers;
- putting up shelves, curtain rails and grab rails;
- fitting smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors;
- fitting and changing door locks and other security features;
- building access ramps and sheds; and
- installing care phones.

THE GIFT OF PROPHECY



Gathering Precious Jewels In 1 Corinthians 12 'Prophecy' is one of a list of Spiritual Gifts 'given for the common good' (verses 7 and 10).

An expression of the Holy Spirit, the Prophetic gift can be seen at work when the people of God gather together. A direct word of encouragement or guidance may be given, a prayer spoken out (or sung) that declares the truth about God's character, or a Scripture reading that 'speaks' in to someone's difficult or confusing situation. Someone may have an impression or mental 'picture' of something, this may be spoken out - or be expressed in an artistic way; a drawing, making an object or perhaps designing a colourful Banner. Often the prophetic gifting goes alongside a strong desire to see 'wholeness' or 'rightness' for a person or situation. There will always be agreement with Scripture in the Holy Bible.

At the Fountain of Life we value the different forms in which the work of the Holy Spirit, through the Prophetic gift, is revealed. We believe that God can speak directly to us in these ways, and continue to record and gather the different precious 'jewels' of the Prophetic expressed within our Church Fellowship.

Archway

It's Adam Jackson from Archway - a new organisation set up to oversee Intents Youth Festival, the Young Adults' Retreat and Also, the Treehouse Festival, an Eco Building and environmental week in July - Treehousefestival.co.uk. The outward looking vision of Intents - the inward vision is to give people the opportunity to make an informed choice about the Gospel of Jesus and ministry in the Holy Spirit - is to be a service to churches whereby they can bring youth groups along without the hard work or high cost of organising a retreat themselves. We sort out everything so that the youth workers and volunteers are freed up to spend time with the young people, building relationship and doing youth work. ST STEPHEN'S CHURCH



The participation in the Fountain Network started before the network was fully formed and was only a twinkle in Stephen Mawditt's

eye. Fountain of Life church provided back-up, expertise, preachers and musicians in a joint project providing a monthly evening service in Norwich, at that time at St Helen's. This moved to St Stephen's in 2009 and then changed into a weekly 4.00pm service in June 2010. It evolved again at the end of 2011 and two services one at 11.30 on Sunday morning and another at 4.00 on Sunday afternoon were launched independent of Fountain of Life. This working together formed bonds of friendship between people which have persisted. St Stephen's was also catapulted into a huge building project by a crack in the chancel in 2009. We have lived in a time of daily miracles which have seen a £650,000 building project turn a city centre medieval church in a space fit for modern people. The congregation were only 50 strong at the start and despite the death of many of the original older members, has now nearly doubled in size. People have come to faith and we have seen healing in several different forms the most remarkable is the lady who was bipolar, suicidal and had for years been under the care psychiatrists. Since being led through a "spiritual spring clean" based on the promises of Jesus, she has not had a depressive or manic incident and is full of the love of the Lord and serving in the church.

We need prayer for inspiration as to how to liberate the people who have gathered into using their God given gifts, and for the energy to run a rolling programme of Alpha courses. Lots of wisdom and discernment is needed to build on the foundations established in the last 4 years.

CASTING OUT FEAR IN THE CONGO

Eldred Willey is taking a new direction this year as he spends five months gaining experience with a Samaritans Purse team. It is working in eastern Congo, spreading the love of Jesus among refugees. It was the intercessor Mark Sutcliffe who suggested applying to Samaritans Purse. Soon after, one of Eldred's Christian colleagues (who knew nothing about the idea) had a dream about him filling in an application, and told him to go for it.

The Congo team is delivering food, water and tarps to people who have suffered atrocities from the Lord's Resistance Army. In its lamentable history, the LRA has killed some 400,000 people and abducted 60,000 children. Its leader, Joseph Kony, is the world's most wanted war criminal. To people who are often too terrorised to sleep in their homes or farm their fields, Samaritans Purse is witnessing that perfect love casts out fear.

This has been a big step for Käthi and Eldred, especially as they have no local family support. Käthi could not go this time because an old house needs to be sold and their daughter Nadia is returning later this year from studying abroad in Spain and France and is needing support to re-launch (probably back to Spain) before Eldred returns.

They need to find a new easy-maintenance base camp which they can leave behind, enabling them to serve on mission together in the future.

They would appreciate prayers for this, and also for the safety of the Congo team and for their work.

SMG

SMG meets every 2nd and 4th Saturday from 1.30 - 3.30pm. We run a cycle of 15 sessions and then start again. We can't quite believe we are on our 3rd session of our 2nd cycle, still early days but exciting days. We start each session reminding ourselves why we call our group the Special Me Group - it's simply because we are all special to God. Our aim is to give everyone the opportunity to get to know about God and Jesus, this may be by using sign enhanced English, for others it's through the ability to learn a song with a simple but Jesus centred message. We have done this through songs specially-written by the Christian charity Prospects. The songs are easy to remember and hard to forget! Everyone is able to join in the music through singing, signing and flag waving. For others it is the opportunity to act out a passage from the Bible or to create something to take home, which will help them to remember the message. One parent commented that her daughter regularly goes to church where she is a welcome and valued member, but she loves coming to the Special Me Group because the message is delivered in a way that is easy for her to understand and learn about Jesus. It is not only our guests with additional needs who are finding out more about the kingdom of heaven, the leaders are learning alongside them. On average 20 people attend, including guests with carers, sibling and volunteer leaders. We have been meeting at St. Michael's School but will shortly be moving to Newton Flotman Primary School.



We welcome prayers for continued growth of the group and for the move to Newton Flotman School.

THE MINISTRY OF JOY

In what we call a springboard approach, we help groups and churches build fun days and fundraisers, one off events or crazy new projects that allow them to make contact with people they would not usually be able to meet. The hope is that relationships will be built that lead to much longer term care, ministering and participation than just one day can allow.



The Ministry of Joy has been forming and growing for 3 years now and has seen many amazing things that God is doing around the county. God has blessed us with the encouragement of seeing our brothers and sisters eagerness to see the kingdom come in so many diverse places and God has blessed us with the joy of seeing young hearts turning to him through first making relationships with his people and ultimately starting a relationship with him. It's an exciting time to be a Christian the harvest is ripe and who said work in the field had to be boring. If you would like to pray for us we would love to see fulfilled a prophetic vision we've been given for a team to gather around the ministry, we would love to make this journey with others. Secondly, if you could pray for humility in us that we act out the knowledge that it is God's work and not ours, empowered by his spirit and not a business model, as we grow we don't want to forget ourselves.

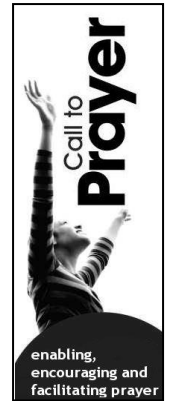

CALL TO PRAYER

Call to Prayer's links with the Fountain of Life congregation go back to the 90s, when it was birthed out of the Living Water event that took place annually on Norwich Showground. Since then our journey with the Lord has brought us from being a small number getting together to pray to a diverse team blessed with a wonderful base at the House of Prayer in Norwich. Local church leaders commissioned us as a prayer ministry in April 2008, recognising that we are here to serve the church, which we have been doing for many years.

We took on the lease of the House of Prayer in January 2011, and the ministry has grown steadily in fulfilling the calling and vision given to us. We marvel at God's grace in releasing hitherto unrecognised gifts in His people and His faithfulness in providing resources of every kind to enable the work to go forward. With regular gatherings for prayer, teaching and fellowship meals, the building is being well used. Above all we long for it to be a sanctuary of prayer and worship, where the tangible presence of God dwells, such that those entering the House of Prayer will encounter Him.

Call to Prayer is closely linked with Roy & Daphne Godwin from Ffald-y-Brenin in Pembrokeshire, and we have recently helped set up over 20 Local Houses of Prayer across Norfolk, with more being added. Inspired by their teaching on blessing, Jill and two others have collaborated to write two prayer resources. The second one, *Keep on Praying and Bless*, which deals with everyday situations including government and community, is currently going out countrywide.



Our full-size Tabernacle and Jill's passion for Hebrew roots teaching form an important part of our ministry. In this vein an exciting event will be a conference at Belsey Bridge, Ditchingham in July 2013, with Chris Hill of CL Ministries.

Good news and exciting opportunities abound, and we feel we are caught up in something God is doing in these times, with amazing testimonies when we took to the streets recently and prayed for people with two young American evangelists. The heart of our ministry is all about Jesus - worshipping and seeking the Lamb of God in His Glory. We would value your prayers for more team members to support the vision, for protection and strength and for God to increase and bless all that He is opening up to us right now.

CHIPS

CHIPS works to contribute to peace in areas of tension and conflict around the world through a practical, grassroots, biblically based approach, learning from the example and teaching of Christ. We live incarnationally, in the heart of the tension area and at the economic level of the people we work amongst, forming teams of Christians from all sides of the conflict who come to live, eat and pray together. These teams undertake practical projects to serve the needs of all communities involved, engaging people in cooperative and mutually beneficial activities which build new relationships.

CHIPS was founded by Roy Calvocoressi as he led pioneering work in Cyprus in the late 1960s. CHIPS had numerous other projects through the 70s & 80s and, since 1990, has been working with the Karimojong and Iteso tribes in North Eastern Uganda. In the last 6 years more than 20,000 people have settled in ethnically mixed communities along the border between these two peoples, on what were formerly the battlefields of conflict.

Since 2010 CHIPS has been working in North Eastern Ghana in an area which has experienced much conflict in recent decades, particularly a major outbreak of violence in 1994-5. We now have an ethnically mixed team living together and undertaking practical projects such as animal rearing and sanitation work. CHIPS has built up small enterprises by training Community Animal Health Workers who use the skills they learn to provide veterinary services in remote areas, gaining a valuable source of income while also building relationships with neighbours from all ethnic groups.

Please pray for: 1) a new base for CHIPS in the UK, 2) people in the UK to join and train with CHIPS, 3) new female team members from both tribes to join the team in Ghana.

CLOVERFIELD

I lead Cloverfield Community Church in Thetford, which was planted 20 years ago in a new housing area on the edge of the town. I had been asking the Lord to show me a place of his leading. There were lots of options, but I needed specifics! The vacancy at Cloverfield had been mentioned to me, along with a list of others. I put them all on 'the back burner' and set out to enjoy a summer holiday. During that time away I heard someone speaking on 'The Parable of the Sower' and it had a profound impact. I felt very convicted that I had allowed myself to become overly busy and had moved away from the essence of what I was called to do; I needed to return to the simple act of sowing seed. As I engaged with God, in repentance, and recommitted myself to be a sower of his seed, I heard him speak, as clearly as I ever had - he simply said, "Cloverfield".



And so I believe that God has called us, as a Church, to simply scatter seed on our field. It doesn't need to be precise and measured planting; I feel he just wants us to keep flinging the seed out, wherever and whenever we can. As with any sowing, it has taken time to see some growth - it's just over 2 years since I arrived. But the good news is that we're now beginning to see some tiny shoots, in all sorts of places; and some of them quite unexpected!

Meanwhile we're still sowing - we'd appreciate prayer for a Community Fun Day which we'll be running on June 8th of this year, followed by a 'Chocolate Sunday' on the 9th - *taste and see that the Lord is good!*

BURN 24/7 Norwich is a gathering of believers hungry to seek the Presence of God in extended periods of worship, to be transformed to go out and love the world. Burn Norwich seeks to gather worshippers from across the region, to create a space for people to worship God and to shift the heavens and atmosphere over the city! It is about coming together in unity in the Presence of God as we are transformed and filled up to go out in love - the Great Commandment into the Great Commission!

The vision for BURN Norwich came out of a 3-day worship festival called 'David's Tent' (<http://davidstent.net/>) that was launched in May last year. Burn Norwich is part of 'Burn 24/7', a movement "of the bride of Christ returning back to her first love." Just as Jesus appointed the twelve to first of all "be with Him" before they were called to "Go out into all the world", this is the DNA of the Burn (<http://burn24-7.com/about/>).

In September 2012 we launched with a 12-hour Burn in a tent in the countryside just outside Norwich and it was incredible. The presence of God was awesome, people were healed, and lives were transformed. We then moved the Burn into the city, to House of Prayer on Fishergate, and have had Burns almost every month since. We have had dozens of worship-leaders from various churches in the city lead us, God's presence consistently powerfully present, people come in from the street, teams go out to love the shoppers, and increasing numbers worshipping God with all their hearts! On Easter Saturday eve we are having a 12-hour Burn in St Stephen's right in the city centre. Please pray for continued expectation of His presence, people's lives changed, and a broadening of those involved/attending. And please come, all welcome!

CENTRAL ASIA

Hello. My name is George and I am living in Central Asia with my wife and 2-year-old son. I am teaching English here with an organisation which is keen to impact this city and region in a number of ways:

- Through English teaching, movie club and conversation clubs through the week.
- The “English Cup” café which is a great place to meet and get to know students.
- Our Community Care department make weekly home visits to many local people who can’t get out of the house or who need help at home.
- Through the shipping department and warehouse and we distribute humanitarian aid all over Central Asia.

The organisation began in 2004 and we have been here since February 2012.

Just last week we had a container of wheelchairs arrive from the USA. There is always much paperwork to be done at customs. This time our team had to obtain a document certifying that this was “Medical Equipment”- otherwise a large import tax would have to be paid. They were sent to the local medical centre, who sent them to another city who sent them to the capital who sent them back here- each party reluctant to take responsibility. In the end, the local centre cleared them, and the broker processed the shipment for free which has never happened before. Next week we will pass on the 200 wheelchairs to a youth organisation in the capital.

The 8th March was International Women’s Day and it is a big celebration here. Women are blessed by the men. So, I joined our Community Care team who went to visit an elderly lady called Nina who lives by herself and can’t get out of the house. We took her a rose and gifts that I presented to her.

Please pray for deepening relationships with the 2 guys I meet up with for language practice and for our own spiritual health and development as we learn to live in this language and culture.
