Dear Friends,

Jubilee celebrations are now history and attention turns to the Olympics with a gathering momentum of prayer and blessing being decreed over our nation. There is a tangible sense of rising expectation. Moses' prayer of old: 'Remember that this nation is your people' (Exodus 33:13) is finding echoes across the land. Not least at St Paul's Cathedral with the singing of the Jubilee Anthem which contained the entreaty:



Lord of wisdom, Lord of truth, Lord of justice, Lord of mercy; Walk beside us down the years till we see you in your glory.

Followed by the answer from heaven: *I am here, I am with you. I have called; do you hear me?*

We believe this is a prophetic call to recognise the voice of the Lord over the waters of the nation and return to Him so that we may be restored. As has been observed so often before, it begins with one life at a time and it can start with us. For those of us who have heard God's call the promise is that He is with us. It has always been that way: for Abraham and Jacob; Moses and Joshua; Gideon and David; Jeremiah and Isaiah. Now, of course, since the days of Jesus, God is with us in an even more intimate and immediate way as he dwells in us by His Holy Spirit. He is with us: that's for sure; the question is: do we hear His call?

As a church leadership and trustees we are collectively seeking, as best we can, to listen and respond to His call. The response on Gift Day demonstrates again the measure of real commitment you have to see the Kingdom come - £22,000 is a huge amount to pledge on top of giving which is already sacrificial and bucks the economic trend of charitable giving!

At last Saturday's meeting of the church trustees it encouraged us to believe that the balance will come and so we have stepped out and added Freddy Hedley to our staff team. He will particularly be tasked with developing training and equipping resources which will help us continue to make disciples and equip the whole of body of Christ for ministry.

Moses went on to say: 'If your Presence does not go with us, do not send us up from here.' It's a great prayer to make our own. It's the real source of revival. It's the real deal and it's all we need to live and thrive. Seek Him and live!
