Martin Down is founder of the Fountain of Life church in Ashill. Martin is retired from full-time ministry and is our resident theologian.

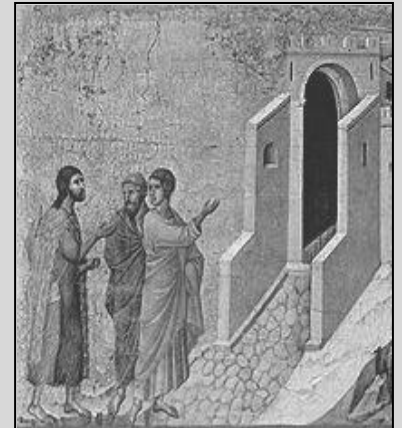

Dear Friends,

Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life - Alleluia! At our annual meeting there was so much life to reflect upon - if you missed Adam's fantastic video of our activities over the past year then watch it on the FoL website. It's an extraordinary reflection on our life together and a wonderful testimony to the faithfulness and grace of God. It also reflects the desire and hunger here to see people come to faith and grow in discipleship; your willingness to take risks and do things differently; your love for Jesus which leads to an amazing level of sacrifice and fruitfulness.



Looking back raises our faith levels for the future. There are areas of our life together in which we need to see the resurrection power of Jesus at work. In our finances as a church we need to see our income increase to match our level of expenditure; we need a fresh crop of wonderful interns for the 2011/12 season; Freddy has set a high target for students in our next NWTP intake. That's just three areas of this church's life. The good news is that we follow a God who gives life to the dead and calls things that are not as though they were. As we look back we can be amazed at the many ways in which we have proved the truth of that promise and it encourages us to press in to all that God has for us in the future.

We have now commissioned a team from *The Rock* to establish a missional community in Blofield and this, together with *FoL Norwich*, has sown the seeds for the Network structure to grow. This too will exercise our faith over the coming year as we speak life to those bones. Our villages, towns, communities, workplaces, schools need God. Our region and nation stands in need of revival. It is so exciting to lead a church which has a vision for nothing less.

Over the 40 days between Easter Day and His ascension, Jesus appeared on at least eleven separate occasions to many people. That experience typically filled those involved with peace and joy. After one of these occasions, on the road to Emmaus, the disciples commented to each other: 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?' At the heart of revival is the revival of the heart: hearts on fire in the presence of Jesus. We pray that each of us may encounter Him afresh during this Easter season, in a way that leaves an indelible mark.

TIM McMAHON IN TATARSTAN WITH EURASIAN MINISTRIES

Pray for Tim McMahon's teaching and planning at college 24-30 April

I head out to Russia on Saturday to teach returning graduate church-planters for a week, from the book of Zechariah, on the theme of building God's kingdom despite being politically powerless and a tiny minority in oppressed circumstances. These are exciting but also unsettling times - please pray for faith by all the college staff and for me, as we grapple with significant issues for the college's future ministry.

Distressing Uzbek News

Sad news I have just received about Christian ministry in the capital city of Uzbekistan emphasises how utterly essential *Eurasian Missionary College's* ministry is for equipping evangelists and church-planters for the region. *Tashkent Theological Seminary (TTS)* was closed by the government a few years ago but its equipment was used by a nearby church and also for underground educational ministries. Later this church was also closed by the government.



Last week all the property and equipment of TTS was confiscated by government police. All of the office equipment, computers and even air conditioners were taken. TTS had the biggest Christian library in Uzbekistan, but now all of the books have been confiscated by the police. The pastor of the church and president of the seminary have been ordered to pay enormous fines by the government, which will almost certainly lead to imprisonment as the sums involved are extortionate. No formal Christian ministry training has been conducted in the country for some years, but now there is a concerted government effort to stamp out clandestine publication of Christian training materials. Uzbek pastors and church planters can only safely receive training out of the country. Please pray for the Uzbek churches, and for *Eurasian Missionary College* as we consider whether we can help alleviate this distress.
