Dear Friends,

At our celebration and annual meeting I mentioned a book by Steve Addison called 'Movements that change the world'. He researches historic and present-day missionary movements that have had a transforming impact on society - such as Wesley and Methodism, the Moravians, the Celtic missionaries, the Pentecostals and Alpha.



He suggests that such movements share five common characteristics. The first of these is white-hot faith. It's the fuel that missionary movements run on. The secret of Jesus' life and ministry was his loving relationship with the Father and dependence on the power of the Holy Spirit; all fired in the furnace of dependence, obedience and suffering. Jesus taught his followers to seek the same intimacy with the Father and expect the same power to be witnesses to the ends of the earth.

There are two means by which God develops white-hot faith in us - crisis and process. Crisis can bring us to a deeper reliance upon God as we renounce dependence on anything other than his presence and power. As we bring our brokenness and need to God we find He transforms and empowers ordinary people like us to go on to do extraordinary things.

But no movement can be sustained on crisis experiences alone. There needs to be a life-long process or discipline which enables that faith to be continuously refreshed.

At the end of the month comes the *Father's Heart* weekend. I'm not sure whether it fits as a 'crisis' or part of the 'process'! But one thing is for sure - it promises to stoke the fires of our faith. Don't miss it! See inside for more information.

Then, in the autumn there's the opportunity to ignite the faith of others by inviting them along to the *Just 10* series. *Just 10* teaches the timeless truths contained in the ten commandments in a relevant and accessible way for a 2010 world. We'll be teaching this in all the age groups over ten weeks on Sunday mornings backed up by bible study materials explored by the home groups. It all begins on Sunday September 19th.

By way of preparation, on Saturday 26th June we are running *Breaking News*, a practical course designed to increase our confidence and effectiveness in sharing the good news of Jesus.

Just imagine what God can do with people of continuous white-hot faith. Stoke the fires, Lord!

Jill Gower, Director of *Call to Prayer*, has always had a passion for teaching the Old and New Testaments from Genesis to Revelation in such a way that we learn to see the bible as one undivided book. So, very naturally, she loves to teach on the *Hebrew Roots* of our faith and their fulfilment in Jesus. There are so many things we miss when we do not know our Hebrew roots, and the traditions of the Jewish people.'

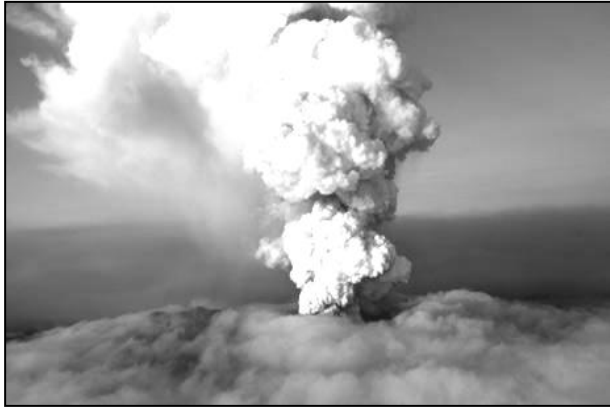

THE ICELANDIC VOLCANO

The extraordinary effect of this volcano, which in a single day wiped all aeroplanes out of the sky over England and Europe, seems to me to be a demonstration of God's power.



I was reminded of a prophecy concerning volcanoes given about England in July 2008 by Jim Gall who was prophesying to the nations that evening at a Tent Meeting in Lakeland, Florida, during the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Ignited Church in that town. This particular night was afterwards described as one of the five most dramatic nights of the Outpouring. Two calls were made that night, one to the nations, the other to the English.

When our turn came the English were called to the front. We were told that two audible words were

given to Jim Gall concerning England - these were 'England Ablaze.' He said there would be spiritual volcanoes erupting all over England and spreading out to the surrounding areas. God also told Jim that at the moment he spoke these words, the lights would go out. This duly happened. All the lights went out in the tent and the surrounding area as the four of us were visiting Florida from the Fountain of Life witnessed. Also, when all was in darkness I saw, as it were, through the roof of the tent into the sky, extraordinary lights, like sheet lightning flashing back and forth over the sky. I thought it was a storm but there was no storm and anyway I was inside the tent at the time from where the sky was not actually visible. On our way back to the hotel after the meeting we saw the electricity being restored after the power-cut.

CONQUERING 'THE NOTHING'

HAPPY NEW YEAR! This is it, this was the year for Susan Rose, everything was going to change I could feel it. Those three little words brought me such a hope: Happy New Year. New opportunities, new everything! Change was about to happen, I could feel it. I had been building up *Drama Healing Ministry* a while now and had had a good November, busy and full of travelling. It was followed by a quiet December but I thought that was good - time to refresh and get ready for the New Year. If I had known what was to come after New Year, would I have said those words with such excitement or would I have run? The last two months up to the present day as you read this have been some of the hardest I have ever had to face. What has happened, I hear you ask? In one phrase: 'the nothing.' I call it this because that is exactly what it is: a nothing.

Running a ministry is hard enough in itself. It sets you aside, rejection comes thick and fast, uncertainty becomes your friend and 'living by faith' becomes your favourite phrase. As soon as January had arrived it started with no money, no work from any avenue, friendships closed off and silence from God. It felt as if someone had put me in a grey room with no door and no windows. My life was flat-lining in front of my very eyes! A season, I thought, so pray through it and get out; but I was praying and praying and still nothing changed. Just more silence. The days turned to weeks and the weeks to months. I kept claiming the truth of who God was, what His promises were, that this was my calling, but still silence. Nothing happening. To say I was confused would be an understatement. Anger and frustration grew, my heart hurt, I felt abandoned and I started to become convinced that I was on the wrong path. Surely our loving heavenly father wouldn't have brought me down this road ... or would he?

All I knew to do was to pray. So I prayed. I started to listen and then it happened. One ordinary day when I was doing my usual routine of 'pleading' with God I had a vision. I saw two grey mountains with jagged walls - a miserable place in itself - and there was a valley going through the mountains and I was walking through it. All around me were sharp edges, the rock was grey and there was nothing there. Occasionally I came across someone chained to the wall. A non-Christian, I wondered? No, they were Christians but they had decided to stay put in this awful place. The vision ended. I asked God, why would someone stay there? There was nothing. It was 'the nothing' I was facing and I was walking through it. I wasn't getting a short cut or being rescued, which so many of us want. I had to keep walking through it and trust God - I would come out the other side. 'The nothing' - strange, you may say. Maybe it reminds you, as it did me, of the film *The Never Ending Story*, a film that see's the nothing come and destroy their world and take it away? Or you may hear in your heart that well known bible verse Psalm 23:4 - 'Even when I walk through the dark valley of death I will not be afraid...'

When God spoke this to me I was a bit shocked. I wasn't dying, but in a way I was. God was dealing with me and certain areas of my life that needed sorting. He was teaching me, disciplining me and getting me to realise that letting go of it all - dying to self - brings life in Christ.

In the gospel days giving someone a loaf of bread may have saved their life but now some Hovis just won't cut it, even if it is whole grain! DESTINY CHILDREN'S CHOIR

On Monday 28th June the *Destiny Africa Children's Choir* is coming to share their joyful music and their story of hope. Dressed in colourful garb, the choir will present a lively mix of traditional and contemporary songs and dances - and some awesome drumming.

The choir is comprised of orphaned children, rescued from horrific and desperate situations in the war-torn and AIDS-ravaged villages of Uganda. They are now living and going to school at the *Kampala Children's Centre* - a growing community of homes, a school, a farm, youth centre, workshop and other facilities among which these children live, learn and thrive.



Kampala Children's Centre was the vision of Pastor Arnold Muwonge, who now serves as its Director. Located outside of the city of Kampala, the Centre was for more than twelve years just a vision in Pastor Arnold's dreams. It opened in 2005, and is now home to almost 100 children. The goal for *Kampala Children's Centre* is to eventually be able to house, educate and care for at least 1000 orphans from within Uganda. And the hope is that when these children reach age 18 they will go back into the communities to work, or go on to university, creating change and a better future for them and for their country.

Contributions will be accepted at the choir's performance to help fund the growth and maintenance of the *Kampala Children's Centre*. Details of booking for this concert and times will be advertised soon.
