Dear Friends,

Revival! We pray for it. We all long for it. But, is it really possible for the quality of society to be transformed by the values of the Kingdom of God in a way that lasts? Jesus clearly expected the answer to be yes - the yeast of the Gospel rising in the dough of the world.



In Britain during the late 19th and early 20th centuries crime was significantly reduced from levels at the beginning of the 19th, to the extent that by 1894 only 4% of prison sentences were for longer than 12 months; alcohol consumption steadily declined; drug abuse was minimal; births outside marriage significantly fell during a period when measurement of births was becoming more accurate. All this was during the lifetime of the generations who had attended the Sunday School movement - 55% of children under 15 attended between 1860 and 1920. Co-incidence? I think not.

Society was transformed by the generations who at least knew about the story of God and the values of Christian morality. Once the baton of faith stopped being passed on down the generations then all of the above dramatically escalated from the late 1950s. A huge encouragement to our *Kidz Klub* and youth teams to keep investing in our children and young people and to take a long-term view - even a 100-year perspective. But also an encouragement to us all to keep the testimony alive of what God has done in the person of Jesus Christ and in our lives. It's our responsibility.

Here's how Bill Johnson puts it in his latest book *Release the Power of Jesus*: 'True revival not only calls people to pursue God, but also to pursue their purpose in history and to partner with Him in establishing His dominion over all things. The Holy Spirit doesn't come to give us a shot in the arm; He comes to help us run the race to the end and pass the baton to the next generation with the intent that Kingdom momentum will increase with each succeeding generation.'

During Advent we're encouraging you to read this book - see inside for details on how to order it at discount prices! Also, during Advent we're encouraging a season of prayer. We shall open the worship centre for 30 minutes of prayer at 8am and 5pm each day Monday-Saturday to seek more of the presence and power of Jesus. All of us can join in either by coming or praying at home.

Let's pursue God and pray as David prayed: 'O God, you are my God, earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you, my body longs for you, in a dry and weary land where there is no water'. Ps 63:1


NEW OPPORTUNITY AT WAYLAND HIGH SCHOOL

THE MARRIAGE COURSE

The Fountain of Life has run *The Marriage Course* for a few years now and over that time several couples have experienced the joy of learning new things and renewing old things in their marriages.

Most people, when they first hear about *The Marriage Course*, say 'There's nothing wrong with my marriage.' Thank God, but for most of us nothing wrong doesn't mean everything is right. Fred and I have run and consequently partaken in this course several times and we can only say that we have always finished with a greater expectation of our marriage getting better and better. It's a joy to realise that our lives together can be more loving as we learn to appreciate the gifts each one of us has and how much we can enjoy as we communicate with one-another on deeper level.

It covers aspects of building strong foundations, the art of communication, resolving conflict, the power of forgiveness, parents and in-laws, good sex and love in action. It gives practical tools to strengthen relationships and time for each other to discuss issues that sometimes get missed out in our busy lives. The course starts with a lovely candlelit meal. You are then invited to watch a video, during which

It seems like we have only just started but already we are a sixth of the way through the first year of the New Wine Training Partnership. And it has been an excellent start! With only weeks to go we were still trusting God for the right number of students and for the technology to work and as ever, He has provided all that we need. We have eight enthusiastic students who have settled into the pattern of study really well and our mixture of live teaching, mixed with some pre-recorded sessions and video conference seminars has worked extremely well (though there have been some close calls!).

The year started with a week's residential, which was the students' first exposure to the taught content of the course. It was a challenging, inspiring and, in many cases, transforming time as the depth of theological exploration led to significant new revelation - an excellent opener to the course. Since then we have had four hub nights and now, as we come into two reading weeks, there is time to take stock of how far we've come. God has been so good to us as we have pioneered this exciting training.

But we still need your prayers! In particular, the students are now writing their first essays and so prayers for them to find the time and inspiration are important and very welcome. After that, we resume our hub nights and we would really value your prayers for God's continued provision for the quality delivery of these, and for God to come by His Spirit and renew our hearts as he transforms our minds. It has been a really encouraging start, and I am so excited for where it feels like God is taking us as a church as we host this training. Thank you Lord - more Lord!

NEW BOOKS FROM FREDDY HEDLEY

Two new books by Freddy Hedley have been published at the end of October and are available to buy now:

Lessons from Antioch explores the biblical account of the church in Antioch, comparing it to today's Western world and seeking to understand what we can learn from this amazing example of a church that grew in faith and numbers and released Barnabas and Paul to spread the Gospel across Asia Minor and into Europe. This book was originally published in 2007 but this second edition includes 100 pages of new material, including a whole new chapter on the importance and nature of encouragement.

The Lost Story: The Scroll of Remembrance is a fiction adventure story for ages 12+ and follows the journey of Barney Brown as he discovers a Forgotten World and is sent on a quest to find the White King, who had once travelled the land telling a story that had once changed people's lives but has since been lost. The story is in the form of a straight (well, quite funny hopefully!) fantasy adventure but is also written as an analogy for the adventure of seeking God.

There is growing pressure to exclude Jesus Christ from the public domain, consigning Him instead to the realm of the 'private and personal.' Increasingly, Christians are encountering attempts to restrict their freedom to speak and live in accordance with biblical teaching in the workplace and in public life. Do you remember the plight of Lydia Playfoot, Shirley Chaplin and Gary McFarlane? Just three of the many who have recently been persecuted in this country.

CAR PARK



These last few weeks have been such fun but also so challenging. I had been training with the person who oversees the baby house ready for when she left for three weeks. Working in the baby house is so much fun and I love building relationships with the babies/toddlers as well as the ladies who work in the baby house, although the language barrier has once again been a slight problem. However, I am starting to really remember new words. I am still doing my admin work and I am taking two days off from the baby house to do this. This will slow down in a few weeks, which means I can then spend more time in the baby house.

I have moved out from the house I was in and from now on, I shall be staying at different people's houses. However on the 13th October I shall be settling in one place to house-sit for some missionaries. They are doing some work for *Iris Ministries* in Europe. I shall stay in this house until I leave for Christmas in December. Please pray that all this moving about will go all right and that I will have time to pack my things each time I move.
