He has given us the increase with our adult membership doubling and our connection with young people and children simply exploding. We have seen the expansion of Kidz Klub into schools, additional Saturday Klubs at Scarning and Thetford and the growth of ID and Intents; First Steps pre-school is the first step of Andrea's vision to see a Christian family centre. We have seen a flourishing of vision and gifting, leading to new ministries starting and existing ones being strengthened; the multiplication of the staff team, and more people released into leadership. The Lord has provided Freddy to take responsibility for this. Having our own 'home' has enabled us to host so much more: men's conferences, women together, New Wine events, the Father's heart weekend to name but a few.

Is this it? By no means! In surfing terms, it feels to me as if we are paddling out to catch the next wave. We've had a great ride, but right now we're waiting for the next. When I mentioned this to Paul he said: 'I hope there is another wave coming and I hope it's a ripper!' Yes and amen! The wave is God's to create but we get to ride it!

There have been many comments in the media about the impact of Steve Jobs' life (the founder of Apple who recently died). The Times editorial commented: 'his greatest strengths were that he was brave enough to think differently, bold enough to believe he could change the world, and talented enough to do it.'

The world in which we live needs to change: the Arab Spring has resulted in more persecution for Christians rather than less, the EU is bankrupt, the global economy fragile, and here in the UK the evidence of recession increases day by day as does the threat of further moral and ethical decline. 

## MEET THE INTERNS 2

Last month we heard from Dave and Emma about why they had decided to stay on for a second year. This month, it's the turn of our two new interns, Mary and Helen. And the question is: what brought you to Fountain of Life?

**Mary:** Why I am at Fol? I have been at university for two years, studying to become a teacher, and involved with the Christian Union at university and my church in the town. I was voted onto the Christian Union committee as secretary, and really enjoyed my time organising and helping at events serving the university and local town. I have decided to take a year out from university and spend the year serving God in some way. I heard about the Internship here and decided to apply for it. I hope to learn a lot this year, and gain experience in different settings within the church, and community.



**Helen:** Why am I here? The truth can be summed-up in six words, but I would like to expand on it a bit. I am from Mattishall and my home church is All Saint's Mattishall. I have been experiencing God more often in the last year or so, and I feel that He is calling me into church leadership. When I heard about the internship, I thought it sounded like just the thing to help me find out if I understood what I was hearing. Then as the application process moved along, I felt more and more strongly that I was meant to do this. I am here because 'God told me to do this.'



## MERCY

It is a real privilege, and very exciting, to partner with various churches and organisations in the Thetford area, representing FoL as part of the Initial Steering Group to get the *Foodbank Project* off the ground (the 130<sup>th</sup> seeded by Trussell Trust [see [www.trusselltrust.org](http://www.trusselltrust.org)] whose goal is for every town to have one). The wider rural area will also be included.

Hunger is not just a third world problem. 13 million people live below the poverty line in the UK and there is evidence that this number is growing. Today, people across the UK will struggle to feed themselves and their families. Redundancy, illness, benefit delay, domestic violence, debt, family breakdown and paying for heating during winter are just some of the reasons why people go hungry.

*Foodbanks* provide a minimum of three days emergency food and support to people experiencing crisis and who rely on the support of local communities. Last year the UK *Foodbank* network fed over 60,000 people experiencing food poverty.

Thetford *Foodbank* aims to help prevent crime, housing loss, family breakdown and mental health problems. A simple box of food makes a big difference. All food will be donated by the public and sorted by volunteers. Front line care professionals such as doctors and social workers will identify people in crisis and issue a food voucher. Clients will receive three days of nutritionally balanced, non-perishable food in exchange for their food voucher. The *Foodbank* will also make time to chat and to signpost clients to other helpful services.

There are inevitable running costs associated with this type of project and there are and will be opportunities for giving, either financially or by donating items from the 'Foodbank shopping list', volunteering to collect food from supermarkets or sorting and packing food at the *Foodbank* warehouse, or getting involved in other fundraising events.

Working in sixteen schools across the area means that we meet approximately 3000 children every half term (six weeks) through our assemblies programme. We run lively, well attended lunchtime clubs in four schools each week and we soon plan to launch two after-school homework clubs. We've had a fantastic summer with approximately 260 children attending our spy themed holiday clubs both in Scarning and Ashill. This would not be possible without equally fantastic teams of volunteers, including our young team who add so much energy, excitement and act as such good role models to the kids that attend our clubs.

It was particularly encouraging for Tim and I to see two of our young team who have grown up through *Kidz Klub* tell stories at holiday club of what God is doing in their lives. Children *really* do need to know that there is someone that will always be

there for them, will comfort them, strengthen them and bring them hope.

*'We will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done.'* Psalm 78:4

So, what happens when children begin to grow out of *Kidz Klub? ID*, a monthly group headed up by Matt and team, offers a place where young people can continue their journey with us and, we hope, with Jesus! ## DISCOVERING TREASURES OF THEOLOGY

November's Digging Deeper is on Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> November 2011, when Alaric Hunt will be speaking on 'Freedom: exploring the theology and good practice of deliverance ministry.'

He says:

"Of all the many different ministries of Jesus, perhaps the most controversial in our western culture is his deliverance ministry. The approach I believe of many western Christians to it is to make one of two basic errors, either to ignore the devil and the demonic or overemphasise him.

In these sessions we will look closely at Jesus' deliverance ministry, the theology behind it and give keys to a workable approach to its practice in our 21<sup>st</sup> century lives. The day will be of benefit to those needing freedom in an area or areas of their lives and especially those wanting to practice it in their ministries.

As over 25% of the verses in the gospels are given over to Jesus ministry in this area I believe it is worth a more in-depth study."

Alaric has been teaching and practicing this ministry regularly for twenty years, both in his own church (Diss Christian Community Church), across East Anglia and in other nations. He has been a Christian for 33 years and has been transformed by Jesus' healing and deliverance ministry from a life of brokenness, drugs and prison to one of freedom and wholeness.

Digging Deeper happens in the worship centre from 10am-1pm and everyone is welcome to come along - no booking is necessary. There is a nominal cost of £5 to cover speaker expenses and refreshments. ## SPANISH UPDATE

We are almost at the end of our trip to Spain for this autumn. Thank you for your thoughts and prayers, which have been such an encouragement to us. Although four different churches are represented in this group, none of the churches offer fellowship and bible study times that these friends would like, so the Discipleship Group has become a lifeline to them. We have all been asked to pray and listen carefully as to what God is saying about the future of this group. Obviously, we keep in close touch with all these friends when we are back in the UK.

On the Comunidad where we live we have enjoyed some friendly times with Swedish, German, Norwegian and English people. One of our Swedish friends had a birthday party to which we were all invited. We thoroughly enjoyed the unaccompanied singing of some Swedish folk songs, and the buffet was very tasty!

We look forward to returning to Norfolk and being back among our family at the Fountain of Life - we do miss you when we are away. God bless you and see you soon!
