Dear Friends,

As I write this the total for Gift Day stands at £28,386 which is extraordinary and a wonderful testimony to such a faithful God and a family who know the joy of sacrificial giving. Thank you so much for responding to the call. 'Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!' (Phil 4:4).



It's not inappropriate then that 'Faith' is our focus this month. There are different kinds of faith referred to in the Bible. For example, there's the gift of faith (charismata) referred to in 1 Cor 12 which is an absolute assurance that nothing is impossible for God; that he can move any obstacle; a certainty that he is going to intervene miraculously and sovereignly in a situation to bring healing or deliverance.

However, it's faith in the context of it being a fruit or characteristic of the way we live our lives that I want to focus on this month. This faith begins at conversion when we 'hear the message', put our faith in the person of Jesus Christ and trust in his pardon. It's this faith which is then lived out in an ongoing way, not complacently relying on a booth in heaven based on a promise made or a prayer prayed years ago, but daily, even today, demonstrating a dependency and trust in Father God's care, protection and provision. The language used in John 3:16 for 'whoever believes' is literally whoever continues to believe.

This kind of faith endures or perseveres beyond feelings - it holds on when life denies the goodness, love or sovereignty of God. This kind of faith expects or hopes beyond what is reasonable - it holds on to the promise of life everlasting, of his will being good, pleasing and perfect even in the darkest hour. Someone once said: 'faith is the bird who sings while it is still dark'. This kind of faith exercises our will to obey even when the way ahead seems unclear, perilous or beyond our own understanding - trusting without reservation. It's this kind of faith which releases the Kingdom and upon which the church is built.

It's this kind of faith which Jesus had in mind when he said: 'Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe' (John 20:29). It is being 'sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see'. (Heb 11:1).

This month let's echo the words of Paul as we pray for one another: 'I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith.'

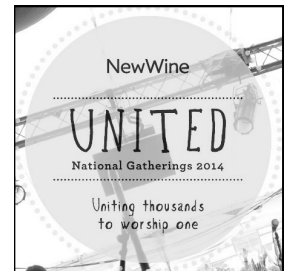
